Which Basketball Program Is Right For You?

Option #1: **Recreation**

- Grades 1st-6th
- No tryouts
- Non-competitive
- 1 practice per week
- Games on Saturdays in Okemos
- December - February
- Shirt is provided

Option #2: **Competitive (Travel)**

- Grades 3rd-8th
- Tryouts
- Competitive
- 2 practices per week
- Games on Saturdays and Sundays
(in Okemos and surrounding communities)
- Tryouts in September/October, games
November - March
- Must purchase uniform
- If cut from team, automatically placed
on Recreation team (grades 3rd-6th
only)

Which Basketball Program Is Right For You?

Option #1: Recreation Basketball

Cost \$70

Registration opens 8/29/24

This is a **non-competitive** program for grades 1st-6th with *no tryouts*.

- Good for players who are just starting out in basketball and would like to learn the basics or continue in a non-competitive program
- Playing time is equal and there is no score
- Practice is 1 night during the week with all games held on Saturdays in Okemos
- Program begins in December and runs through the third week of February
- Shirt is provided

Option #1: Recreation Basketball

When: Usually the first six Saturdays after winter break.

Who: Grades 1st-2nd , 3rd-4th, and 5th-6th. There are 3 combined grade leagues.

Where: This year games will be held at Kinawa and Chippewa Middle Schools

Description: We do not keep score, it is purely to have fun, and the kids always have a good time. The games are reffed by OHS basketball players. The coaches are all volunteers. You can make a friend request and/or coaching request. There is no tryout. Practices are 1 night per week, games are on Saturdays.

Which Basketball Program Is Right For You?

Option #2: Competitive Basketball (Red Cedar League)

Cost \$140

Registration opens 8/29/24

This is a **competitive** program for grades 3rd-8th that *has tryouts*.

- Good for players with basketball experience
- Playing time is not equal, but coaches strive to be fair
- Practice is 2 nights during the week with games held on Saturdays and Sundays
- Hosted by Okemos and surrounding communities
- Tryouts begin in September/October with practice and games running November to March
- Uniforms need to be purchased (Cost: \$52)
- Players who tryout for Red Cedar and are not placed on a team can be automatically registered for Recreational Basketball (with the exception of 7th and 8th graders)

Option #2: Competitive Basketball (Red Cedar League)

When: Tryouts are in September/October for grades 3rd-8th girls and 3rd-6th boys, 7th-8th boys will tryout in December after their school season finishes. Games span from November to March.

Who: Grades 3rd-8th, boys and girls. Must attend Okemos Public Schools to play on a Red Cedar team.

Description: The Red Cedar League has 3 divisions (Bronze/Silver/Gold) with typically 2 teams per grade. To be fair to coaches and respect playing time, we limit teams to 10 players where we can. There are many communities that participate, you will have 4-5 away games. Not everyone is guaranteed a spot. However, if your child does not make a competitive team, they are automatically enrolled in our recreational league (1st-6th grade only) and receive a refund on the difference.

How Do Tryouts Work for Red Cedar?

Preparation

Register through Okemos Community Education.

Every player will receive a tryout jersey with a number on the back. Evaluators will only know students by their numbers, not their names.

Skills Assessment

Three to six evaluators per tryout session will assess the following skills:

- Ball Handling
- Shooting
- Defense
- Passing
- Team play / scrimmage

Evaluators will also make note of attitude and effort.

Selection & Sorting

Evaluators and program coordinator will examine player evaluations, then, as a group, sort them into teams.

Depending on the number of participants, some players may not be placed on a team.

We understand that the tryout process can be stressful and upsetting to some players. We do our best to place players in an unbiased and fair manner.

Competitive Basketball Coaches

Once teams are formed, a committee of OPS staff reviews the coaching applications.

- If you're interested in coaching, please complete [this application](#). You will also need to complete the district's Volunteer Conviction Disclosure form.
- Red Cedar League rules allow for only one coach, one assistant coach, and one team manager.
- We often receive more volunteers than there are spots to fill, so unfortunately volunteering does not guarantee that you will be placed with a team.

After team lists come out, coaches then communicate information regarding practice/games. They also attend a mandatory coaches meeting.

Red Cedar League Divisions

3rd Grade - There is only a bronze league for this age group. If numbers allow, two equal teams will be created

Gold/Silver/Bronze - Coaches, along with coordinator, agree on what league would be appropriate given the roster of the current team. The goal is to place the team in the league with competition that is comparable. Some years we only have a few teams go for the gold division while most play silver and bronze.

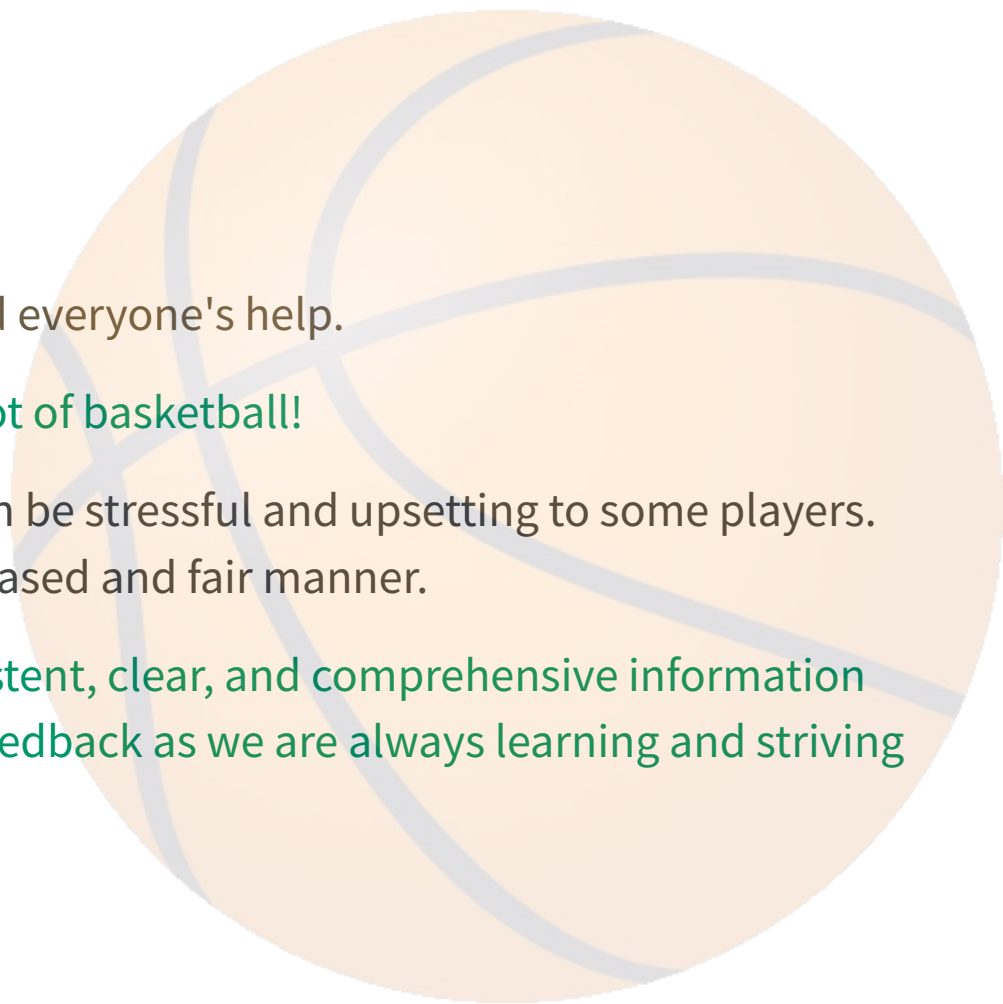
Let's Have a Great Year
